

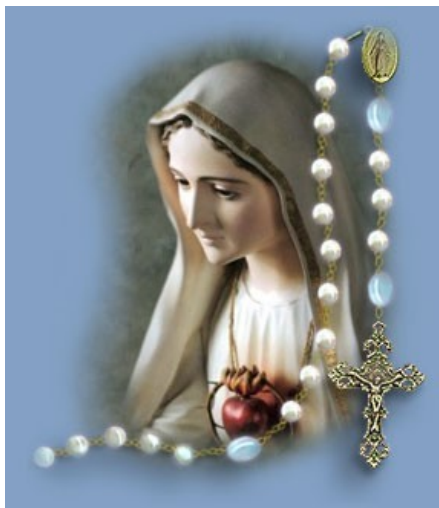
Today is the feast of the Most Holy Rosary.

“The celebrated musician and musical composer Beethoven, as is the lot of all geniuses as well as non-geniuses, had his moments of mental, spiritual, and emotional poverty, in which he felt arid, dull, and altogether non-creative. He had no zest for composition, felt no lure for work, and no ambition to be operative. If anything, in these moments of low-spiritedness and nervous depression, he was weighed down by a disgust for his professional work and a revulsion against every effort to resuscitate his love for it.

“In these heavy and gloomy moments the great artist had the habit of having recourse to the Rosary. After praying it a while with fervor, hope, and love for his heavenly patron, who on earth had heard the sweetest music ever enjoyed by human ears...he became generally animated, spiritually resilient, and mentally resourceful. Inspiration seized him anew, and his genius became inflamed with an irresistible and most delightful urge for musical creation. The Rosary never failed him as a reviving, exhilarating, and energizing factor of his slumbering genius.

“Innumerable men and women, some of them equally as famous as Beethoven, others more or less hidden to fame, representing all classes and professions, derive the same help and comfort, in their relative needs and personal distresses, from the recitation of the Rosary as the great musician got from it. They would feel lost indeed without it.”

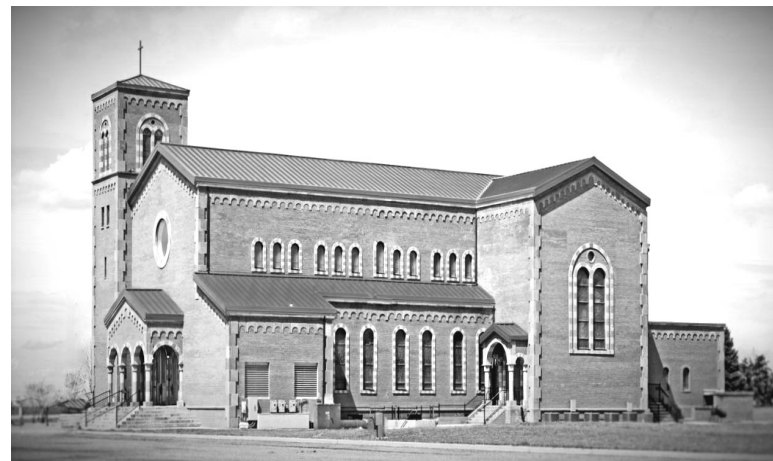
